UPDATE ON CORONAVIRUS

A new political agreement means that research active employees (VIP and TAP) for whom physical attendance is necessary to carry out their research can come to work from Wednesday 27 May. **Read more here.**

Employees who are included in the new reopening will be informed by their line manager.

Students who have teaching or exams that require physical attendance can turn up on campus if they have been notified in their KUmail. Students must, of course, be given reasonable notice if an exam is converted, and therefore this will probably only concern a few exams this summer.

The new agreement also means that clinics, summer schools and master programmes are likely to open from 27 May.

Administrative staff who have not been part of the previous opening phases must continue to work from home until August.


PHYSICS WEBINAR
