
Welcome Back - UCPH and DTU are open!

# Hans Ulrik Nørgaard-Nielsen

Noted Astrophysicist and senior researcher emeritus at DTU Space, Hans Ulrik Nørgaard-Nielsen, who contributed to several significant discoveries throughout his long career, has passed away at the age of 73.

Through his work on the JWST over 20 years, he ensured that DTU Space has significant participation in this huge space project, a

collaboration between ESA and NASA. He looked forward to receiving data from the space telescope that would show whether it could observe the most distant objects, the first created immediately after the Big Bang.

## THE VERY LARGE TELESCOPE



DAWN Postdoc Kasper Heintz is awarded 180 hours at the Very Large Telescope in Chile to study fast radio bursts! # SURVIVING ON A STUDENT BUDGET ₹

Take-Away and eating out is very expensive in Denmark; rather make food from home if you have the choice!

However, if you want to go out and are willing to compromise <u>Absalon Church</u> and other <u>Public Kitchens</u> provide affordable meals, with great company and events. Vegetarian options are also available.

Supermarkets; be aware, there are discount (Lidl, Netto, Fakta, Aldi, Rema 1000) and more luxurious supermarkets (Bilka, Føtex, Daglig Brugsen, Irma, Meny). It really makes a difference choosing your supermarket well!

The "<u>Too Good To Go" app</u> lets you rescue unsold food from shops and restaurants so it doesn't go to waste. Every year, one-third of food is thrown away. Use the app to rescue Surprise Bags filled with delicious, unsold food from businesses near you.



# **COPENHAGEN: CITY OF CYCLISTS**

You haven't experienced Copenhagen until you've cycled through the streets. Luckily, for those who aren't bringing a bicycle with you there are options for cheap bike rental. <u>Swapfiets</u> offers a monthly subscription (from 140 DKK, \$23 per month). This subscription includes reparations and insurance. <u>Copenhagen Bike Rental</u> offers a greater variety of bicycles, however at a higher price point (from 350 DKK per week \$60). <u>Donkey Republic</u> offers a monthly bike-sharing subscription (250 DKK, \$41 per month). This is a slightly more flexible subscription, because you can for instance use their bicycles in other cities (Odense, Aarhus, Aalborg).
