


1st Author's Pub Club





Halloween in Denmark ₹

American-style Halloween is everywhere now, having transformed the ancient and dignified Danish allehelgensaften to a full explosion of plastic and candy.

If Wikipedia can be trusted, the American version of Halloween only took off in Denmark in 2000, when the Danish toy company, Fætter BR began to sell the very first of the princess costumes, zombie makeup sets and pumpkin-shaped candy baskets. Also the production of real pumpkins has raised too, with nearly a million sold every year in Denmark.

American-style Halloween has become so popular not just because it references a deep pagan tradition, but because getting ready for it gives the kids something to do during fall vacation (efterårsferie) in Denmark. Costumes could be made from anything including old velvet curtains for a classic period look, like Scarlett O' Hara's dresses in Gone with the Wind. Other costumers were made from large packing boxes, which could be transformed into robots, a house or even a popular breakfast cereal. Then of course there was always the quick fix: the ghost created from a white bedsheet with cut out eyes, nose and mouth or the witch's costume made from a worn-out black dress and a black hat.

Nowadays, dressing up is probably more fun in Denmark than in the USA, because the politically correct police now dictates which Halloween costumes in the USA are appropriate to be worn. Cowboys and pioneers are no longer heroes; they are imperialist invaders, and of course you must not dress up as Native American if you are not actually, genetically, a Native American (remember to carry your DNA test results!).
